## **XIII. LAND USE HEARING**

A. Request for Waiver to Allow a Body Art Establishment, Ink'd Vessel Tattoo Shop, to operate at 111 West Chaco Street, Aztec, New Mexico

Mayor Burbridge opened the Land Use Hearing for a Request for Waiver to Allow a Body Art Establishment, Ink'd Vessel Tattoo Shop, to operate at 111 West Chaco Street, Aztec, New Mexico. Mayor Burbridge stated that this hearing would be conducted under Procedures mandated by the New Mexico Court of Appeals in Battershell versus the City of Albuquerque, which were intended to protect the due process rights of our parties. Mayor Burbridge subsequently identified the parties and City Staff. Mayor Burbridge then asked Commission if they would accept the parties and they did. She reviewed the procedures and then asked if any members of the Commission had a conflict of interest, bias, or engaged in ex parte communication, there were none. Mayor Burbridge then swore in the parties and reviewed the Order of Presentation.

Utility Director Delain George mentioned that this is a request for waiver to allow a body art establishment to be located at 111 W. Chaco in Aztec. She mentioned that the reason the request is before commission is because under code no body art establishment should be located within 300 feet of a private or public school or church or residence unless waived by City Commission. Delain mentioned that there was one comment that they did not want a tattoo shop to go in that building but did not want to dispute it. Finding of facts were reviewed and there was an amendment to the applicant name Michael Anderson to Michael Morrison.

Michael Morrison, Applicant for the shop mentioned that he will be offering services for free for hate or gang tattoos and he would like to take one day out of the month to teach high school students the art of tattoos.

MOVED by Mayor Pro-Tem Sipe, SECONDED by Commissioner Randall to Approve Request to grant for a Waiver for a Body Art Establishment, To Be Located at 111 W. Chaco St. Aztec Known As Ink'd Vessel Tattoo Shop. Should the Business Move Or Change Ownership, the Waiver Will Be Null and Void, Accepting Findings of Fact 1-8 With The Amendment of the Name Change on Finding of Fact #8

She mentioned that she asked for a copy of the joint powers agreement and by-laws to be sent out to the policy committee members due to question on sharing information. She thanked all the police officers for the job and the risks that

they take daily and mentioned that they are appreciated very much. Mayor Pro-Tem Sipe mentioned that she will be attending the EDAB meeting on Thursday morning.

Commissioner Rogers expressed her appreciation to be able to attend the Mayor's Ball on Saturday and that it was outstanding and much fun.

Commissioner Randall mentioned that he has a Lodger's Tax meeting next Tuesday and that he also attended the Mayor's Ball and was fun.

Commissioner McClure mentioned that she attended the Library Board Meeting and the board nominated a member and a junior member. She made a comment welcoming the tattoo shop.

Larry recognized the police departments and mentioned that they do a tremendous job and he thanks god for them.

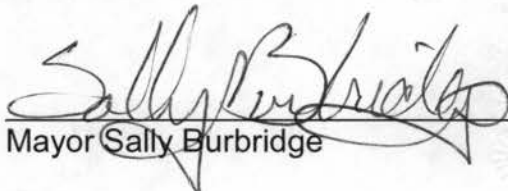
#### **X. DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

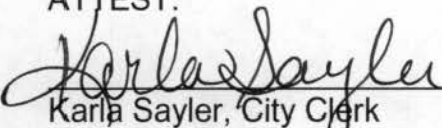
Chief Mike Heal mentioned that Coffee with the Chief will start up again next Tuesday at 6:00pm at the Police Department.

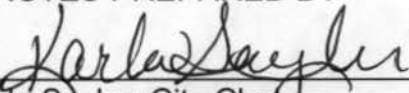
