B. City Manager Employment Agreement

Mayor Burbridge pulled item to include in section 6-B that the personnel committee will meet twice a year or more per commission policies with the City Manager to discuss progress made in meeting the goals and performance objectives as agreed to with the City Commission.

D. Resolution 2017-1059 Adopting the 2018-2022 Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP)

Commissioner McClure questioned the amount funded for Aztec Small Business Incubator. Josh mentioned that the amount of \$500,000 just throws in operations and potential of purchasing the facility but that would only be for any grant funding or state economic development funding that we would receive and without it being on the ICIP plan we will not be able to receive funding.

MOVED by Commissioner Rogers, SECONDED by Commissioner McClure to Approve Resolution 2017-1059 Adopting the 2018-2022 Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP)

XI. CITIZENS INPUT

Dale Greenwood owner of Renovation Outlaws addressed a concern with commission about a notice letter by Code Compliance on items placed outside of the establishment. She contacted Code Compliance Officer and stated that he just asked her to clean up the outside and move items indoors. On July 24 she received another letter and was shocked that she had a criminal complaint against her and has to go to court for improper storage. She is here tonight looking for guidance to see if something cooperative can happen between the businesses and commission so they know exactly what the City is unhappy with and what they can change. She mentioned that since she has been dealing with this her sales have gone down a couple thousand dollars which is major for her business.

Candy Corey mentioned that she has had a business in Aztec for the last 10 years and loves Aztec. She mentioned that she also received a letter that she was not in compliance with City Code. She mentioned that she talked to Steven Saavadra, Community Development Director and she said he told her to build a fence and stack the items outside neat and she did. She mentioned that she was give until August 17th to comply. On August 16th she mentioned that she received a criminal complaint also in the mail that she hadn't complied. She said she built the fence and stacked the items neat and she is here to ask commission how to resolve the issue.

Victor Snover mentioned that he is here to address curb side recycling. He feels that if recycling can help with utility structures it should have been voted on and mentioned that it would be something that citizens would adapt to and that maybe the

recycling center would be more utilized. He mentioned that it was a positive move to single stream recycling.

Mr. Burkett mentioned that his concern is the dust that is being caused on Western Drive with the sewer project. He mentioned that he would appreciate if the City can spray water to keep the dust down. Josh mentioned that the City will get a water truck out there and keep it watered to keep the dust down.

XII. BUSINESS ITEMS

A. Final Adoption of Ordinance 2017-1054 Amending Chapter 16 with the Addition of Section 3-132 Shipping Cargo Containers

Josh mentioned that this ordinance will be introducing shipping containers into City Code. He mentioned that the ordinance has the definition that will be included in code and the districts they will be permissible and prohibited are outlined in the ordinance the permit process and conformance.

MOVED by Commissioner McClure, Seconded by Commissioner Randall to Approve Final Adoption of Ordinance 2017-461 Amending Chapter 16 with the Addition of Section 3-132 Shipping Cargo Containers

XIII. CITY MANAGER/COMMISSIONERS/ATTORNEY REPORTS

Josh mentioned that city staff has been working with contractors and the state on the Arterial project to get it finalized this calendar year. We will bid this year and he mentioned that we are still on track to meet deadlines. He mentioned that we have made good relationships with DOT, the State Land Office, BLM and land owners and mentioned that this is a positive for us moving forward he thinks it will be a benefit for the Arterial once we get the project completed that it will help us develop off that road and the use for the road.

Mayor Burbridge will be attending the Quality of Life meeting at San Juan College tomorrow morning on Gateways and Entrances.

Commissioner Rogers mentioned that it was a great opportunity to attend the NMML Annual Conference in Clovis and mentioned that Mayor Burbridge will be the new President of the League October 1, 2017. She mentioned that she went to the Library for the Solar event. She gave a shout out to the San Juan County Fair Board for the County Fair.


Commissioner McClure thanked the community for calling her this passed week and thanked the community members for coming in and speaking to commission tonight.





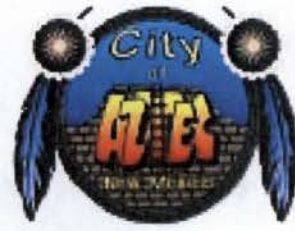
