

US Highway 550: This north-and-south, four-lane highway runs stretches from Bernalillo (just north of Albuquerque) to Aztec to the Colorado state line. Driving time from Albuquerque's international airport to Aztec is approximately three hours.

NM 516: This east-and-west, four-lane highway stretches from Farmington to Aztec. Driving time from Farmington is approximately 15 minutes.
